LOGISTICS

Carnival involves a lot of equipment being set up and moved about for the various events. This work starts on the Friday before carnival weekend and doesn't stop until the Tuesday when all the clearing up has been done.

There are crowd control barriers, gazebos, tables and chairs which have to be set out and packed up at the end of each day.

All of this is done by a willing team who are kept busy whilst having fun. Some work all day whilst others help for a couple of hours when they can. It would be great if we could boost the team for the evening of carnival day!

MARSHALS AND STEWARDS

MARSHALS are required for the 10k Mini Marathon on Sunday and during the Carnival Procession when their role involves:

- Assembling the parade entrants into the correct class for judging.
- Accompanying your class in the procession, making sure that they keep up with the pace and that participants are safe.
- Keeping a sharp eye out to ensure that, in the excitement of the moment, the participants do not get over boisterous when interacting with the crowd

Commitment:

For the 10k Mini-Marathon: From 9.30 until 11.45

For the carnival procession: From 2.00pm until approximately 4.30pm.

STEWARDS are on duty to keep onlookers safe during:

- The Carnival Procession 2.30pm until 4.30pm
- The Evening Entertainment 6.30pm until 8.45pm
- The Fireworks 8.00pm until 10.00pm

Their concern is for the wellbeing and the safety of the public, helping with any queries and incidents that may occur, in particular:

During the Carnival and Lantern Processions ensuring that onlookers keep on the footpaths, clear of moving vehicles and lanterns.

During the evening entertainment to provide safety advice

At the Firework Display ensuring that onlookers keep out of the firework drop zone.

Each steward covers a designated area, so this role is very suitable for someone who does not want to walk too far. Not all stewards are volunteers, in hot spots they are paid professionals.

Commitment: Varies, depending on the session being covered.

Marshals and Stewards have access to radio communication and there are Police and St John Ambulance backup teams to hand.
